You may bring a maximum of five photography-related items to give away at the event. Used items are fine as long as they are in good condition.

June 27 Thursday and June 29 Saturday (two outings)	Planting Fields Arboretum Oyster Bay, Long Island Explore outside grounds, gardens and greenhouse flowers. Close-up lenses helpful.	NYC start at 9:45 am. Shoot until 5:00 pm closing Dinner in Oyster Bay, return 8:30 pm – 9:00 pm.	Plan for both damp/ cool and warm/steamy greenhouse environments after coming inside. Bring snacks, lunch, rain gear and water (cafeteria at the Arboretum). Tripods are not permitted in the greenhouse.

<u>The China Institute</u> (40 Rector Street) is presenting Art of the Mountain: Through the Chinese Photographer's Lens through August 18.

<u>The NYC Transit Museum Annex</u> (Grand Central Station) is showing *Sea Train: Subway Reef Photos By Stephen Mallon*, documenting efforts to re-purpose the retired MTA fleet while strengthening Atlanic shoreline reefs, through June 16.

<u>The Metropolitan Museum of Art</u> (5th Avenue at 83rd St.) will show a new exhibit, *Apollo's Muse: The Moon in the Age of Photography*, July 3 - September 22.

The <u>Brooklyn Botanic Garden</u> (Prospect Park at Eastern Parkway) presents *Roots by Brian Zeigler* through November, 24, 2019, with drawings depicting the complex root systems of edible plants at life-size.


